Tablets were available for hands on review of the discussed apps. Presentation highlights: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Review of types of mobile devices and their operating systems • Explanation of mobile apps and their technical characteristics • Description of app prescriptions and institutions currently developing guides and standards to facilitate their uptake and the regulation of app quality and credibility • Sources for finding medical apps • Criteria for selecting and evaluating apps • Examples of consumer health apps • Information from the discussion following the presentation included: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ➤ Clarification of the use of an app across multiple platforms (e.g. Android vs Apple) or across multiple devices with the same platform (iPhone vs iPad) ➤ Potential sources for lessons on using apps such as tutorials from the Apple store, library user education sessions, and YouTube videos ➤ Upcoming plans for a mobile devices classroom at the University Health Network to walk through apps for UHN staff
